THE PURPOSE OF THE SUBJECT, LEARNING OUTCOMES:

2. be better able to conduct research on a particular topic with a view to providing an analytically sound and complex assessment.
3. be better able to participate in, and lead, professional and healthy discussions and debates on sensitive topics.
4. have improved skills for working in groups and delivering tasks on time.

SUMMARY OF THE CONTENT OF THE SUBJECT

The goal of the Global Politics Advanced Study Group is to bring together talented and interested students to do activities that go beyond the normal curriculum. The content of these activities is driven by the interest of students and might take the shape of inviting experts and practitioners for discussions, study visits, students presenting their thesis or other research work, and group projects. A major goal of the group is to make students more familiar with the world of global politics and with various career options.

STUDENT'S TASKS AND PLANNED LEARNING ACTIVITIES:

Every member is expected to take charge of at least one of the sessions, conducting background research and leading the discussion. Members who are not in charge of a particular session are expected to prepare for the session by familiarizing themselves with the background information provided by the session leaders, and to actively contribute to the discussions.
