THE PURPOSE OF THE SUBJECT, LEARNING OUTCOMES:

The aim of the course is to bring together students coming from very different backgrounds as well as make the foundation for further studies from a language point of view. The course helps students improve their general English language skills and communication skills including their presentation skills. It also provides a wide range of cultural experiences to be compared and contrasted. Students will be exposed to various tools in order to develop their language skills and competences and to reach and exceed a stable B2 level. They will be able to debate, compare and contrast, argue for and against, they will be able to define, memorize and recognize basic concepts, interpret data, apply information and experiences to analyze, discuss and present ideas and their opinion.

SUMMARY OF THE CONTENT OF THE SUBJECT

This course is tailored to develop all key language skills and to make students be able to use English as a foreign language effectively. Students are expected to analyze texts, answer questions and discuss their ideas referring to issues arising from the areas that are covered. The course is interactive and helps students learn some useful techniques necessary to improve their every day, business and academic communication and understand the relevant texts and topics. They are also expected to do individual research into certain topics and present their findings.

STUDENT'S TASKS AND PLANNED LEARNING ACTIVITIES:

The students are expected to actively take part in the lessons, complete hand-in assignments (realted to class work and homework) and to make a presentation based on their research (the possible topics are listed on CooSpace) using visuals and data.

EVALUATION OF THE SUBJECT:

The course has a sharp focus on diagnosis and the continual tracking of the improvement of skills with a view to exploring students' previous knowledge, interests and needs with the help of tests, assignments and various oral and written exercises. There are tests follwing key learning areas but the most important elements are the presentation and active participation during our classes.
