THE PURPOSE OF THE SUBJECT, LEARNING OUTCOMES:

By completing the course, students will be able to read and write in Russian, recognise familiar words and very basic phrases concerning themselves, their family and immediate concrete surroundings when people speak slowly and clearly. They will be able to understand familiar names, words and very simple sentences, for example on notices and posters or in catalogues. They will be able to interact in a simple way provided the other person is prepared to repeat or rephrase things at a slower rate of speech and help them formulate what they are trying to say. They will be able to ask and answer simple questions in areas of immediate need or on very familiar topics. They will be able to use simple phrases and sentences to describe where they live and people they know. They will be able to write a short, simple postcard, for example sending holiday greetings; fill in forms with personal details, for example entering their name, nationality and address on a hotel registration form.

SUMMARY OF THE CONTENT OF THE SUBJECT

Reading and writing in Russian, Personal Pronouns, Possessive Adjectives, Gender of Nouns, Nouns plural, Prepositional Case, Adjectives, Verb conjugations, Cardinal Numbers 1-1000, family, professions, city, sports, everyday expressions, Russian culture

STUDENT'S TASKS AND PLANNED LEARNING ACTIVITIES:

During the semester students will participate in various classroom activities such as warmers, ice-breakers, asking and answering questions, reading and listening comprehension, listening for gist and details of authentic recordings, gap-fill, matching, mingling, pair work, group work, practising functional language, vocabulary in context writing informal letters.

EVALUATION OF THE SUBJECT:

The seminar aims to frequently check students' understanding of the material, give feedback on students' performance and modify tasks and approaches accordingly.

The final mark depends on the result of the mini-tests and the two final tests, as well as participation in classroom activities.
