However, the content of the course is not subject of change. The students will learn how to use theoretic approaches of security policy in analyzing events and how they can formulate critical opinion on the complexity of today's world.

During the course the students need to fulfill a copmplex requirement. The tasks need individual and team work and the ability to present ideas in front of the group in oral and in written form. The individual tasks are assigned at the beginning of the course related to the individual interests, needs and carreer goals of each student.
