THE PURPOSE OF THE SUBJECT, LEARNING OUTCOMES:

STUDENT'S TASKS AND PLANNED LEARNING ACTIVITIES:

Weekly individual projects and presentations and group debates related to these. Performance and activity during semester is an important part of the final evaluation.

EVALUATION OF THE SUBJECT:

Students get examination grades after the completion of the examination in case of lectures and practical courses to be completed together. Such examination grades are the sum of up to 50 points for the evaluation of the work at the practical class and up to 50 points earned at the examination. Only students who have earned at least 25 points for the practical class can be allowed to take the examination. For students who do not meet this requirement, the subject is considered not completed and they must register for it again if they have originally registered for it as a compulsory subject. If the examination score is less than 25 points or have an "did not obtain signature" status in the subject registry in the electronic study administration system, the examination grade is "fail" and the provisions of the assessment and evaluation system of the student's knowledge are to be applied to improve the grade and fulfil the subject requirements. Upon repeated registration for a subject, the practical points previously earned are lost and cannot be counted towards the evaluation of the repeated subject.
