There are two compulsory consultations during the term. During the consultations students will be asked to share their feelings and problems in connection with university-related issues.

EVALUATION OF THE SUBJECT:

The course unit ends in pass or fail. Students who do not exceed the maximum number of missed classes and who attend both consultations will pass the course. In case of non-completion of either of these criteria the course ends in a "fail" grade.
